The purpose of this policy is:

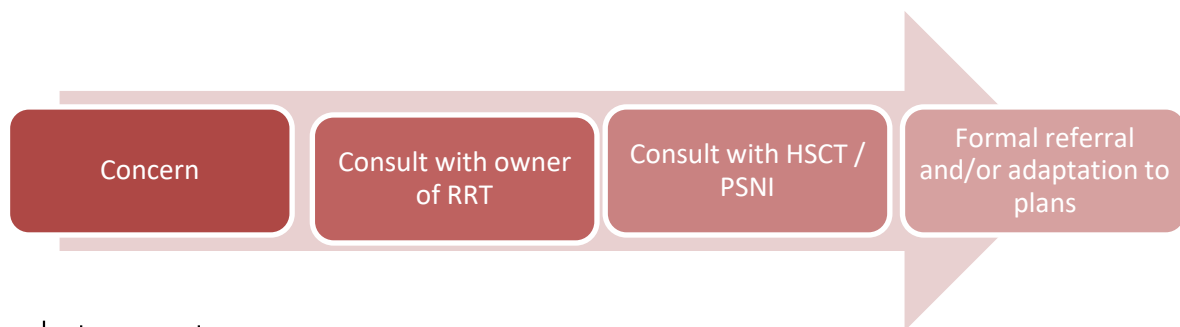
- to protect children and young people who receive RRT’s services. This includes the siblings of children who use our services;
