

Covid-19 is an illness that can affect people's lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. Symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe, or fatal.

This is a risk assessment for Red Robin Therapy (RRT) to deal with the current Covid-19 situation in the workplace. Where RRT is working on behalf of a third-party organisation or at a third-party location, RRT will follow the guidance /requirements of that organisation/location as a minimum requirement but reserves the right to adhere to RRT's risk assessment guidance when necessary.

Symptoms of Covid-19 Prior to any appointment, regardless of the location, a Covid Questionnaire will be administered. Anyone answering 'yes' to one of the questions will not be seen.		
If advised that a child or family member has developed Covid-19 and was recently in contact (including home visits, school visits or clinic), Clare Canale will contact the Public Health Authority to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any actions or precautions that should be taken.

Only one parent will attend with the child.  Cleaning Cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as door handles, light switches, using appropriate cleaning products and methods.  Social Distancing Social distancing will not be possible for parts of a face-to-face assessment.	Child and parent will be asked to wash hands before and after appointment. Cleaning Cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched by children e.g. toys and assessment items, using appropriate cleaning products and methods.	Car handles, steering wheel, handbrake etc will be wiped down between visits, in addition to the measures stated above.		

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Social Distancing Social Distancing - maintaining a 2-metre (6.5 foot) gap when possible. Additional use of PPE when not possible.		1)
Wearing of Gloves Gloves will be worn during home visits. Permission will be sought from parent to wash hands on arrival and when leaving.	If handwashing prior to donning gloves is not possible, hand sanitiser will be used.	
PPE Scrubs will be worn for all domiciliary assessments. These will be worn with an apron. When inside 2m a mask will also be worn. If the child is coughing or sneezing (not Covid- related) a visor will also be worn.	Aprons, gloves, and masks will be removed after the home visit. Items will be placed into a bag and disposed of once home.  Scrubs will be removed once home and washed immediately.
